

# UNM - Los Alamos Campus Safety and Security

## Community

The University of New Mexico Los Alamos Campus, located in Los Alamos, New Mexico, is a community of approximately 1200 students and permanent faculty and staff. Visitors come to our campus to attend lectures, symposia's, concerts, plays, sporting activities and other events. Our campus is surrounded by the incorporated city and county of Los Alamos. With our large and constantly changing student population, we have maintained an extremely low crime rate.

## Mission

The mission of the University of New Mexico-Los Alamos (UNM-LA) is to provide high quality instructional programs and support services to the residents of the communities it serves. Through its educational programs and services, UNM-LA provides a wide range of educational opportunities consistent with the needs and desires of the service population of a local postsecondary institution affiliated with a major university.

The University of New Mexico - Los Alamos Administration makes every effort to provide our students, faculty, staff and visitors with exceptional security services for the preservation of human rights and the protection of people and property. These services are provided with an emphasis on proactive measures, minimizing the need for reactive responses. We strive for positive interaction with outside agencies and maintain a strong, cooperative relationship with the community by respecting differences and fostering a better understanding through communication.

## Protection

The UNM- Los Alamos Administration encourages students, faculty, staff and visitors to promptly report all crimes. Crimes occurring on campus and in Student Housing should be reported to the appropriate police agency (State Police, Los Alamos County Police Department). In an emergency you may dial **911**, non-emergency 662-8222.

## Prevention

**Alarm System** We operate a computerized intrusion and fire alarm system to monitor facilities throughout campus to enhance personal and building security.

**Crime Prevention Materials** Free brochures and other documents regarding crime prevention are available at the UNM Los Alamos Administrative Office and other campus locations.

**Lost and Found** The UNM Los Alamos Administrative Office operates a lost and found service for the Campus.

**Access to Campus Facilities** We strive to make our campus safe by limiting access to buildings after hours. Buildings on campus are generally open during regular business hours, when class is in session and for special events. Persons authorized to remain in a building after closing times are required to have proper identification at all times. Security personnel conduct frequent internal and external checks of buildings on campus.

## Crime Reporting

The UNM Los Alamos Administrative Office encourages anyone who is the victim or witness to any crime to promptly report the incident to the police. Because police reports are public records under state law, the UNM Los Alamos Administration cannot hold reports of crime in confidence.

Confidential reports for purposes of inclusion in the annual disclosure of crime statistics can generally be made to other UNM Los Alamos Campus Administrative authorities. The UNM Los Alamos Administration compiles and reports annual crime statistics to inform the University community about crime and related problems. Statistics are gathered from UNM- Los Alamos Administration reports. After 7 p.m., individuals may reach the administration by contacting any campus employee.

### Drug and Alcohol Policy

The University of New Mexico- Los Alamos policy on illegal drugs and alcohol clearly states the standard for a Drug-Free, alcohol-Free campus. UNM's policy on illegal drugs and alcohol can be found online at <http://www.unm.edu/news/policy2.html> .

The unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of controlled substances or alcohol on UNM- Los Alamos property as part of any activity by any member of the University community faculty staff, or student - is strictly prohibited. Federal and State Laws relating to controlled substances and alcohol are enforced by the UNM- Los Alamos Administration.

As a condition of employment or enrollment, all UNM- Los Alamos employees and students are required to abide by the terms of the policy. Violation of the policy will result in disciplinary action up to and including employee dismissal or student expulsion and/or participation in an approved substance abuse treatment or rehabilitation program.

**Smoking Policy:** Smoking is permitted only in designated areas. This policy is in compliance with the New Mexico Clean Indoor Air Act 1985, and [UNM's Business Policies and Procedures Manual, Policy 2250](#) . Smoking is not permitted in any Los Alamos Campus building

### Weapons Policy

With very few exceptions, employees, students and visitors are not permitted to use or possess weapons on any part of the campus. A weapon includes, but is not limited to: firearms, ammunition and other dangerous weapons, substances, or materials; bombs, explosives, or incendiary devices. Persons who have such weapons in their possession must deposit them with the UNM Los Alamos Administration for the duration of their stay on campus. Any person failing to comply will become subject to appropriate disciplinary and /or criminal action.

## Sex Offender Registration

In accordance with the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2000 (CSPA), UNM-Los Alamos is providing a link to the New Mexico Department of Public Safety for law enforcement agency information concerning registered sex offenders. The CSPA requires institutions of higher education to inform the campus community where law enforcement information provided by a State concerning registered sex offenders may be obtained. It also mandates that sex offenders who are required to register in a State must also give notice of each institution of higher education in that State at which the person is employed, carries on a vocation, or is a student. Additionally, the New Mexico Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) requires a convicted sex offender who is employed by, enrolled at, volunteering with or carrying on a vocation at an institution of higher education to register with the university's law enforcement department, the university registrar, the county sheriff for the county in which the higher education institution is located as well as the county sheriff for the county in which the sex offender resides. Persons required to register with UNM under SORNA should complete the form available on-line at [http://police.unm.edu/sex\\_offenders.htm](http://police.unm.edu/sex_offenders.htm) and submit it to the UNM-Los Alamos Registrar's office. ## Safety

### You Make the Difference

Your safety and security are of prime concern at The University of New Mexico Los Alamos Campus and we at UNM- Los Alamos Administration are working hard to ensure the campus is a safe place to learn, work, and play. UNM - Los Alamos is not, however, exempt from crime. We are doing our part to prevent crimes, but to be safe and secure, **you** must take common sense precautions, be alert and look out for others. Maintaining an effective security department is a community effort, and together we can ensure UNM - Los Alamos remains safe.

### Safety Tips

**W**alk purposefully. Look confident. Watch where you are going. Be alert to your surroundings.

**U**se well - lighted, well-traveled routes. Avoid shortcuts through isolated areas.

**L**ock all doors and close all windows when leaving your car, whether it is for a few minutes or several hours.

**H**ave keys ready when you approach your car. Check the car for intruders before entering and lock your door immediately after getting into your car.

**A**lways lock your bike or motorcycle when leaving it unattended, even if it is only for a few minutes. Use the U-shaped high security lock whenever possible.

**I**f you witness a crime, call Los Alamos Police Department immediately.
