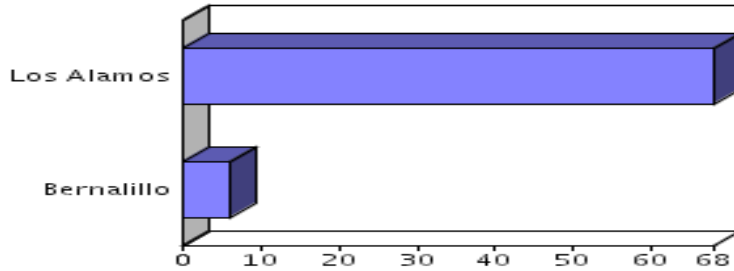

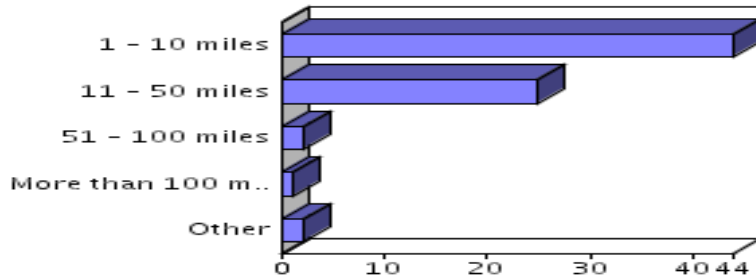

1. Where do you attend the majority of your classes?



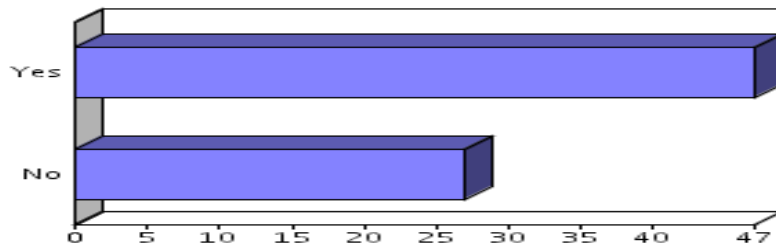

2. How many miles are you commuting one-way to attend classes at UNM-LA?



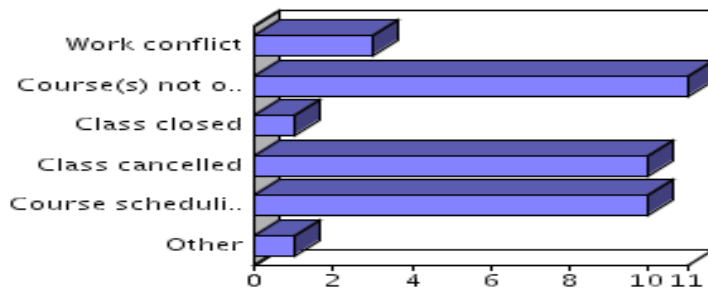

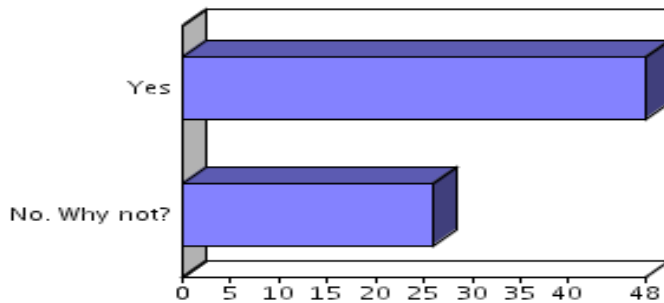

5. Did you seek academic advisement prior to the first day of classes?



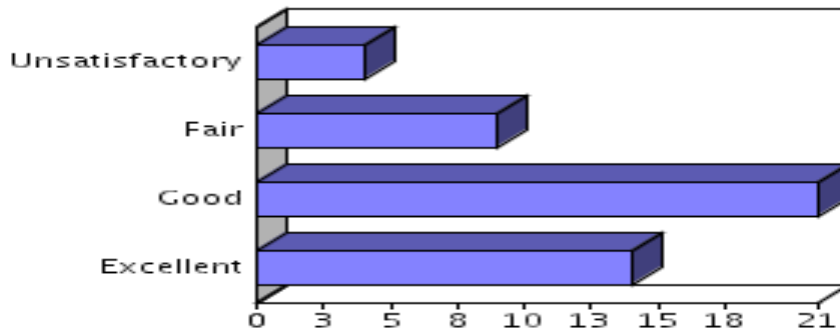

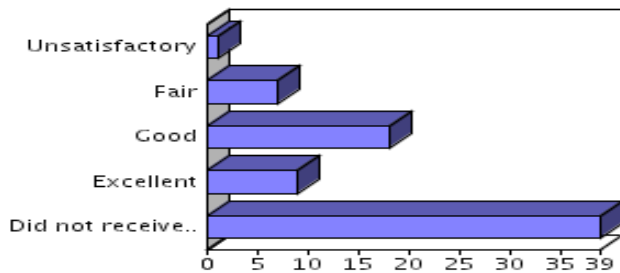

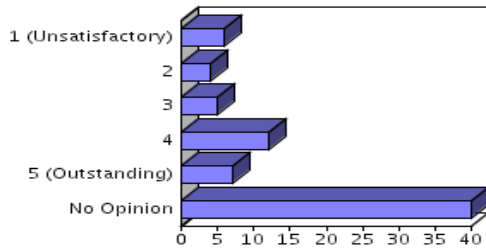
8. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Admissions office?

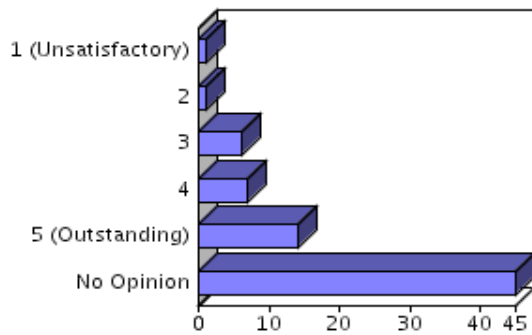
9. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Financial Aid/Scholarships office?

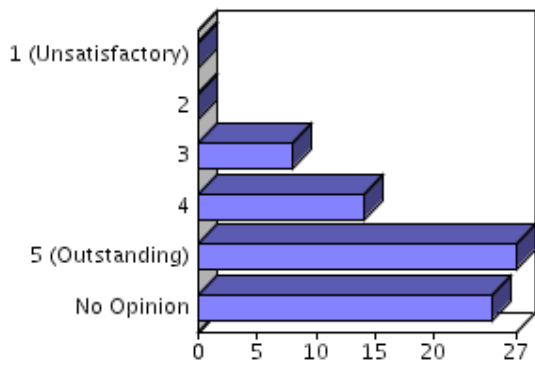
10. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Tutor Center?

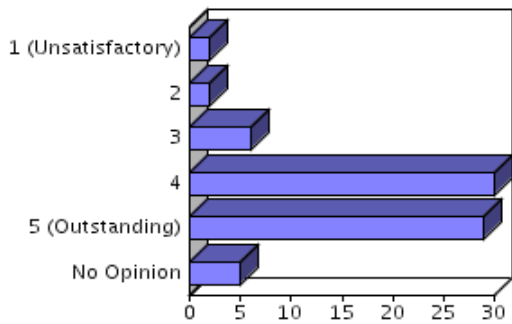
11. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Library?

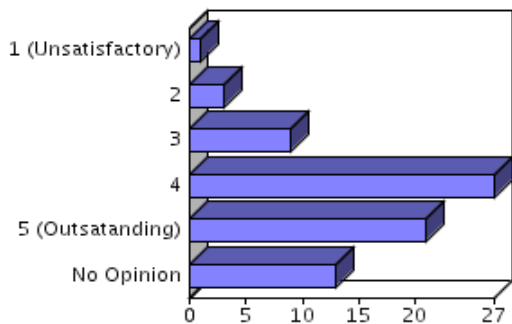
12. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Bookstore:

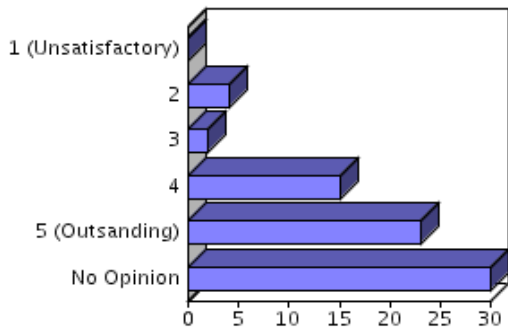
13. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Cashier's Office?

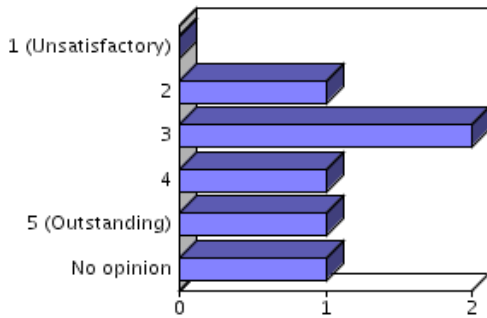
14. How would you rate the service you received at the UNM-Los Alamos Café?

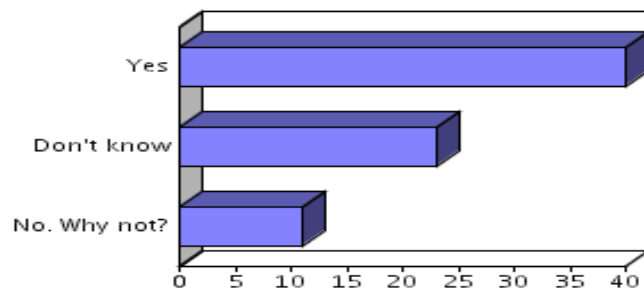

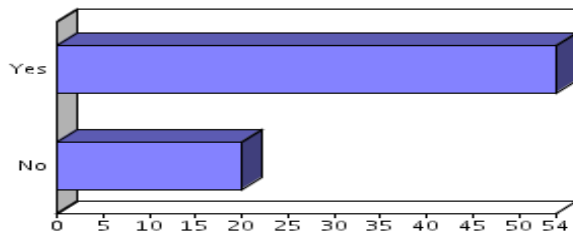
